RUDICING/PREVENTING SHELTER SURRENDERS



The stress of the economy has been hard for many sanctuaries but we have learned some very good lessons. Helping pet owners to solve problems so that they do not need to give up their animals is a great way to keep them out of shelters. Here at Morning Starr Animal Sanctuary we have been able to reduce the intake of the number of animals just by spending a little more time on the phone or in person with people who are thinking about surrendering their family pets. We feel that keeping loved family pets in their homes is always the best solution.

Many are just faced with behavior problems and just need a little training advice or contacts, i.e. trainers, animal behaviorists. Some may just need help with feeding their animals for a short time. Many are thinking that they don't have enough time and feel that their animals are being neglected because they are either working more hours or sometimes two jobs. They just need the reassurance that their animal appreciates every minute and sometimes just wants to sit by their side when they are home and that is enough for them. It sure beats taking an animal out of the environment it feels secure in and putting it into a new stressful situation. I am including animals that are tethered all day and night. I am talking about the average pet that maybe stays at home alone most of the day but is with the family in the evening and through the night. Our animals appreciate the little things.

For people with small animals like ferrets if you don't have time to play withy them it really helps to get an exercise pen and put lots of toys, food, litter box and lots of fluffy blankets. They love to play in them and then you know they are safe and keeping out of trouble. It is better than going to a shelter where they are sometimes one of hundreds of ferrets.

If pet owners are having to give up their pets because of home loss we usually ask them how much time they have and if they have 3 weeks or more we are usually able to get them together with someone who is looking for a pet and that way the animal only has to make one move right into the new home. We matched up 25 ferrets and 4 horses this last year.

People are also afraid to take their pet to the vet because they don't have the extra money to pay for all the tests, visits, meds. etc. After running a sanctuary for almost 10 years we have also learned a little bit about health care and can help some people with general health care issues which reduces their vet bills and in these times is very helpful. Especially with ferrets where sometimes loss of hair is just a matter of changing their food or making their sleeping area a little darker.

Helping people with feral (wild) cats and kittens is also very helpful. Most people think they must get them into a home. We say "trap, neuter, return." I would rather see a feral cat out in the wild and live a few happy years then be taken to a humane society just to be put under enormous stress only to be put down in the end.

Morning Starr is more than happy to try to help with any questions you may have i.e., training, health or anything you are having a problem with. If we can't help right away we will research and see if we can find you help. Maybe you just need a little help with food for your animals for a short time. No problem, we would love to give some cat, dog, ferret or farm animal feed.

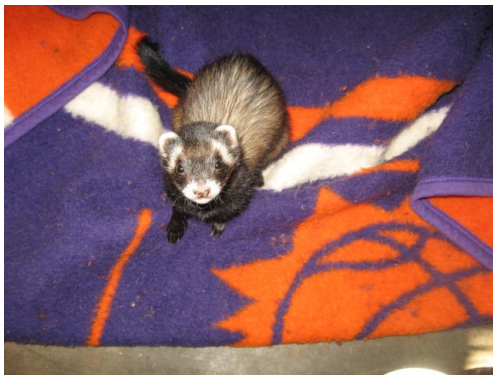
Help!

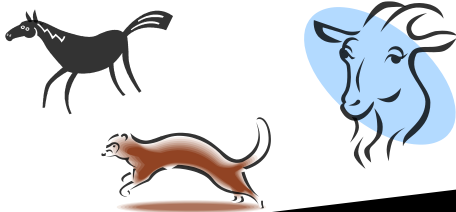
